*Dr. Susan A. MacManus, who received her M.A. from the University of Michigan and Ph.D. from Florida State University, is a Distinguished University Professor at USF in the Department of Government and International Affairs. For the last six election cycles, she has served as political analyst for WFLA NewsChannel 8 (Tampa NBC affiliate). Since 2008, she has been a featured columnist on sayfiereview.com—a widely-read Florida-based political website. WFLA TV's weekly Road to the White House program on which MacManus appeared as a panelist was nominated for a Suncoast Emmy award in 2008. She has appeared on every major broadcast and cable television and radio network and been interviewed by major newspapers in Florida, the U.S., and abroad. She is Florida's most-quoted political scientist.


MacManus is the co-author of Politics in States and Communities, 13th ed., with Thomas R. Dye (Prentice Hall 2009), Florida's Politics, 2nd ed., with Thomas R. Dye and Aubrey Jewett (Florida Institute of Government, 2007) and Florida's Politics: Ten Media Markets, One Powerful State with Kevin Hill and Dario Moreno (Florida Institute of Government, 2004). She is also the author of Young v. Old: Generational Combat in the 21st Century? (Westview, 1996) and Targeting Senior Voters (Rowman & Littlefield, 2004). MacManus and her mother. Elizabeth, are the authors of two local Florida history books published by the University of Tampa Press: Citrus, Sawmills, Critters & Crackers (1998) and Going, Going, Almost Gone: Lutz-Land O' Lakes Pioneers Share Their Precious Memories (forthcoming, 2010). MacManus is from a citrus-growing family in Pasco County.

Clearwater AAUW Board Meeting Minutes November 7, 2013

Rita Garvey called the meeting to order at 10:15 a.m. in the Conference Room 1 in Clearwater's Main Library. She declared a forum with three officers present: President Rita Garvey; Program Vice President Dana Garlick; and Treasurer Carol Zeph. Jan Stephens joined the Board a little later.

Secretary's Report: It was announced that Kathleen Kimpel has resigned as secretary. Dana will take notes. The reports for the previous meetings were accepted.

Dana shared letters of thanks with the board from St. Petersburg College's Women on the Way (WOW). Four students received \$500 scholarships from the funds we donated. Dana will publish the letters in the newsletter for members to see.

Rita reported that Clearwater Branch will work with the Tampa Branch and help host the Florida AAUW State Convention April 4 and 5. Volunteers will be needed to help with registration and helping other members find their way around. The convention will be held at the Sheraton Tampa East Hotel at 10221 Princess Palm Avenue, Tampa. All our members will be encouraged to help.

Dana read a letter from WOW Coordinator Shirley Crumbley describing a family who would like to be adopted for Christmas. Dana will put a note in the newsletter requesting members help by making monetary donations to purchase a gift card that the mother can use to purchase what she needs for her family. The gift card must be brought to the WOW office by Dec. 3.

Rita reported that she has been talking to someone at University of South Florida to have students digitize our Branch's collection of scrapbooks. The scrapbooks are deteriorating and if not saved in this fashion soon, our 65 years of history could be lost.

Rita announced there will be another Tech Trek Camp. This year it will be at Eckerd College. The Venice Branch will be coordinating it. Instead of our awarding the top 8th grade math and science students, we will be informing the teachers at Dunedin, Largo, and Safety Harbor about the possibility of some grade 7 students attending this program which is held in July. Rita will send letters to let them know.

Jan Stephens would like more publicity about AAUW during the Annual Fundraiser this year. Instead of baskets, we will try to acquire gift cards to restaurants, gas stations, grocery stores, movies, etc. to use for the Basket Fair. She will create a form letter that members can give to merchants. The letter might include the cover letter from SPC describing the four latest scholarship recipients mentioned above.

The next board meeting will be on January 25, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. preceding the Annual LWV-AAUW meeting with Susan MacManus in the dining room. Any members coming early will be welcome.
